We pay for each patient that uses a service on either a zero based contract or a payment by results basis from the total funding allocation we are given by NHS England (money we are given to fund all the services we commission). - During 2026/27, BNSSG ICB, in partnership with relevant stakeholders, is going to develop new models of care for weight management services during 2026/27. It is therefore too early to provide details of planned timelines or anticipated impacts.
